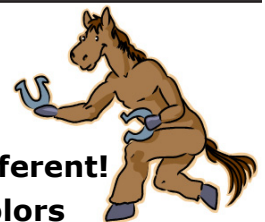
Like to Bowl? The OK Corral has bowling for you! Friday from 2:30 to 5:00. \$8.00 will get you 3 games and shoes!
