

WHAT WE DO

The following Faculty Development Program presentations are available for all clubs throughout the Multiple District and can be presented by members of the MD19 Faculty Development Team. The presentations are generally twenty minutes in length and can be presented during a club meeting as part of the club program. Clubs or Zone Chairpersons who would like to schedule a presentation at a club or Zone meeting should contact the Leadership Chair of their District Club Support team or the MD19 Faculty Development Chairperson. Contact information for these Lions is found in the MD19 Roster mailed out each August to the Club Presidents and Secretaries, Zone Chairpersons, MD19 Council and Committee Chairpersons.

Faculty Development Program Presentations:

Each of the presentations listed below is designed to fit into a 20 minute club program unless otherwise stated in the description

Building a New Club-This is a step by step description of the process a Lions club should use to create and build a new club in its area. This includes a checklist for sponsoring a new club. This presentation would normally be given by the Extension Chairperson of the District Club Support Team.

Club Branches-This presentation describes the characteristics and organizational structure of a club branch, as well as the procedure for creating one. This presentation takes approximately ten minutes.

Club Membership Committee-This outlines the duties, functions and structure of the club membership committee. It discusses the specific duties of the Club Membership Director, the Vice Chairperson and the members of the committee.

Club Planning Sessions-This is a discussion of Club retreats. It addresses issues which can be added to a retreat agenda such as planning, team building, problem solving, and conflict resolution. It outlines the objectives of a retreat, its organization structure (i.e. who does what) location selection and duration.

Developing and Retaining Members- This is a **workshop** for club members designed to evaluate the reasons members leave a club and gives members an opportunity to determine solutions for preventing losses in their club. This workshop requires from 45 minutes to an hour and may require a separate club meeting.

Do's and Don'ts of a Club meeting- This is a "Down to Earth" practical approach to making a Lions Club meeting both successful and fun. It discusses behavior at meeting, how to set up a meeting room, and prior meeting planning.

Effective Club Meetings-The roles of club officers at a Lions club meeting is presented. The importance of prior planning and leadership is discussed as well as the dynamics of group meetings.

How Your Club Can Use Public Relations –This discusses the ways in which your club can make your club’s achievements and events known to the public. It includes sample news releases, public speaking events, public service announcements, websites, and resources available.

Increasing Your Membership with Quality Lions-This presentation provides a systematic recruiting procedure for a club. It helps a club define a quality Lion and provides ideas for bringing them into the club.

Keeping Lions Involved – This presentation discusses why Lions leave a club and how the club can get them involved in a variety of club activities, including both new and long time members.

Keep Them-This is a short presentation dealing with **management of your Club’s Retention, Growth & Health**. This presentation is from five to ten minutes.

Lions Quest-How to Present it to your Community- This is a brief summation of the LCI Lions Quest Program. Facts and Figures are presented to illustrate the effectiveness of Lions Quest. Ways to bring this program to your community are suggested.

The Lions Story- This is a short presentation for the public and can be made available to clubs to use at an open house or other recruiting events.

Membership Growth Can Be a Success.-This is a **workshop** which emphasizes team building within the club to recruit members. Club members develop their own plan in the workshop based upon the material presented to them. This workshop will take from 45 minutes to one hour.

Open Houses-A step by step approach is presented for running an open house to recruit new members, based upon the MD19 model.

Scruggs Presentation-This is a presentation developed by Past International President Sid Scruggs. It covers Membership, Extension, Retention and Leadership

SMART Project Planning- How to create a club project using SMART goals. This includes establishing goals, planning for their achievement and evaluating progress.

So You Want to Grow-This presentation discusses the Passion it takes to be a leader in Lions and to dedicate one’s self to creating growth. This is a motivational presentation.

The Club Excellence Program- This presentation summarizes the purpose and content of the LCI Club Excellence program. It is designed to introduce the program to the club members to assist them in **making the decision to commit to the program.**

The Care and Feeding of New Lions-What each club member needs to do to insure that new members are properly welcomed into the club.

The Power of Individual Mentoring-This creates the argument that all new Lions must be mentored in order make the commitment to Lionism. This includes a brief overview of the **Lion for Life and the Strive for Five Programs**.

What The Club Support Team Can Do for YOUR Club- This looks at each position in the Club Support Team (Leadership, Extension, Membership, Public Relations, Retention, and Training) and explains how the Team members can and will support their clubs.

What is Project Mentoring- This discusses how to keep a club project on track from beginning to end to ensure successful completion.

Why Should YOU take Lions Leadership 101-This discusses the purposes and benefits of Leadership 101, both for the Lions Clubs and for the individual leader or aspiring leader.

Officer Training Modules:

Four Officer training modules are available. These are based upon the MD19 Officer manuals. These can be used with the officer manuals during the training session. The modules can be completed in two hours, except secretary training which takes a minimum of three.
